The Legend of Fat Mama (2005) - Directed by Rafeeq ELLIAS

A multiple award winning documentary by **Rafeeq Ellias** for BBC World, broadcast in over 200 countries, it is the story of India's tiny Chinese community in Kolkata's 'melting wok'. The bittersweet story of the Chinese community in Calcutta intertwined with the nostalgic journey in search of a woman who once made the most delicious noodles in the city's Chinatown district. Discover thriving street food, disappearing family-run eateries, mah-jong clubs, a Chinese printing press that has shut down and its handwritten counterpart that continues to deliver the news every morning, and the first all-woman dragon dance group preparing for the Chinese New Year. Share the pain and hurt these Chinese have experienced at the treatment of their people in the aftermath of the Indo-China war, causing many of them to migrate to Canada and elsewhere. Enjoy the spirit of the Chinese New Year, a time for renewal, generosity and hope. Above all, experience the ever-binding ties of tandoori chicken and Hindi cinema.

Beyond Barbed Wires: A Distant Dawn (2015) - Directed by Rafeeq ELLIAS



Like Japanese-Americans after Pearl Harbour, on a smaller but equally poignant scale, 3000 members of India's tiny Chinese community were incarcerated in an old POW camp for up to 4 years in the aftermath of the India-China war of 1962. Even children, expectant mothers and the elderly were not spared. Most people don't know about this tragic episode. There is no acknowledgment or apology either from the government to date. And yet, among those who suffered, the love for India and things Indian remain alongside the pain and hurt. It's a story that reminds us that history has a way of repeating itself. Again and again. "

The Way to my Father's Village (1988) - Directed by Richard FUNG



In the fall of 1986, Richard Fung made his first visit to his father's birthplace, a village in southern Guangdong, China. This experimental documentary examines the way children of immigrants relate to the land of their parents, and focuses on the ongoing subjective construction of history and memory. The Way to My Father's Village juxtaposes the son's search for his own historical roots, and his father's avoidance of his cultural heritage." "In the autumn of 1986, shortly after his dad's death, Richard traveled to his father's village in southern Guangdong. His father, Eugene Fong (whose name was changed by an immigration

official to Fung), emigrated to Trinidad in the early 20th century. Separated from his father's village by two generations, Richard decides to retrace his father's journey in an attempt to understand him more intimately.
